## Mr. Arresto's Grading Policy

<u>Attitude Grade</u> – Everyone begins each marking period with a 50 / 50 for his or her attitude grade. Come prepared to class and participate in any way that you can. Participate positively – arrive prepared, complete class assignments, ask questions, add comments, and listen to others – and your grade will remain the same. If you shout out your ideas, interrupt others, are frequently unprepared, are disrespectful in class, or **simply don't participate**, you will lose points off of this grade.

<u>Homework Grade</u> - All homework assignments must be copied into your Bellmore-Merrick Daily Planner every day. It is the first thing that you will do each day - do not wait for me to tell you to copy the HW. Come into the room, take out your planner, and start copying the HW from the white board by my desk.

- ⇒ Each HW assignment is worth five (5) points towards your HW grade.
- ⇒ Some homework assignments will be collected and graded, while others may just be checked and reviewed in class.
- ⇒ I will consider sloppy or incomplete homework to be late until it is done properly. Take pride in your work, and show me that you're a hard worker.
- ⇒ If you are having a tough time with a homework assignment, try your best!

  No effort = no credit.
- ⇒ If you do not do your HW, you have **one day** to make it up for half credit.
- ⇒ Failure to hand in a homework assignment will result in a grade of ZERO.

When you are absent, you are expected to go to the class website (<a href="www.sarresto.weebly.com">www.sarresto.weebly.com</a>) and complete the work that you've missed for that day. You are also responsible for copying any notes you may have missed from one of your classmates and going to extra help (in room 141) if necessary.

<u>Tests and Quizzes</u> – Unit tests are always announced days in advance. Some quizzes will be announced, such as spelling, and some will not, such as those based on a previous night's reading assignment or a previous day's class work. ALWAYS BE PREPARED!

- ⇒ All missed tests or quizzes must be made up after school in extra help or during lunch in the testing room no later than three days after you return to school. Failure to make up a quiz or test during this time will result in a grade of ZERO.
  - ⇒ Spelling and pop quizzes will be made up the day you return from an absence.
  - ⇒ The lowest QUIZ grade will be dropped each marking period.





<u>Rewrites</u> – You will have an opportunity to earn back partial credit for MOST writing assignments in this class. All students should take advantage of this allowance – the extra work is worth it! If you are going to rewrite a particular writing assignment, YOU MUST COME TO EXTRA HELP FIRST!

**Special Circumstances** – As we all know, special circumstances occasionally arise that prevent us from accomplishing what we normally would. If you misplace any colored handout, go to my class website and reprint it from the "Important Handouts" dropdown. Also, when you clean out your binder, do not throw out the work: you can use those materials to study for the final.

#### How Do I Figure Out My Average?

I use **summative scoring**, which means that each marking period there will be a certain number of points to be earned (X). To figure out your average, divide the total number of points that **you** earned by X. You will enter all of your grades onto your "grade sheet." Keep this sheet in your "grades" folder, and use it to compute your average at any time.

# Guidelines for Mr. Arresto's Class
